No. 6 – Two Hearts Revealed

Jonah 4:1-11

Review

God, in his mercy, tells Jonah to go to Nineveh and call out against it

Jonah silently says “No” and tries to run away

God, in his mercy, pursues Jonah, hurling a great storm and appointing a great fish.

God, in his mercy, tells Jonah a second time, to go to Nineveh and call out against it

Jonah silently goes and delivers God's message

Nineveh repents and God, in his mercy, relents
